We have had our Summer Shows at Accrington Town Hall, Ramsbottom Town Hall, Oswaldtwistle Mills, Read Garden Centre, Shackleton Garden Centre and our present location Barton Grange Garden Centre

The Society has spawned one or two bonsai artists as in Tony Tickle, Terry Foster and Dave Prescott (who wrote the 'Bonsai Handbook')
